About the Carolina Thread Trail

The Carolina Thread Trail is a network of trails, greenways, blueways and conservation corridors that will eventually reach 15 counties in North and South Carolina. It's a project that connects communities and will be a conservation landmark for our region. The Thread offers opportunities for us to bike, hike, fish, paddle and simply reconnect with nature. The project is all about community. The Thread will be designed, built and owned by the counties, towns and citizens through which it is woven. With technical resources and catalytic funding from The Thread, local communities plan and implement their portions of this green interstate system. Catawba Lands Conservancy is the lead agency for The Thread, working in partnership with the Trust for Public Land, Foundation for the Carolinas, and many local partners.
